DEFIBRILLATOR

We have just taken delivery of a defibrillator funded through our Extended School Cluster funding. Whilst we hope that we are never in the position to have to use such a device, it is reassuring knowing that its use could form an essential life-saving step in the chain of survival for a pupil or a parent. The defibrillator is currently stored in the school office, if any parent should find themselves in the position of coming across someone taking a cardiac arrest. Please remember it is vital to call 999 and start CPR, before getting someone to get the defibrillator.

NOTIFICATION LETTER

The chairman of the Board of Governors has received notification of a school inspection scheduled to begin the 28th November. As you may already be aware, the teaching unions in NI have declared industrial action and as part of the directive, teaching staff at Dromore Road are following union advice and not co-operating with the Education and Training Inspectorate (ETI). The teachers will however provide the evidence that the arrangements for safeguarding pupils at Dromore Road reflect the guidance from the Department of Education, as we value the trust you have in us each day when you entrust your child in our care.

Open Day and New Admissions 2019/20

We plan to have an Open Afternoon on WEDNESDAY 12th DECEMBER for all of our current parents and any prospective new parents. This is to allow parents to see around the classrooms and to get an insight into what your child has been learning this term. All the teachers will also be in their classroom, so please feel free to ask any questions you may have. Tea/coffee and shortbread will be available in the assembly hall. To facilitate this, the school will close at 1.30pm, current parents are welcome to view around the school at this time. The Education Authority (EA) also plan to introduce new online applications for admissions for preschool and primary school places for September 2019 intake. A new portal for parents to apply online for a place has been created and this replaces the current paper-based application form. The Go Live date for the new digital admissions is Wednesday 2nd January 2019 at 10am. The closing time and date for punctual applications will be 12.00 midnight on Thursday 31st January 2019. As this is a new approach, the EA is also planning to provide Assisted Digital Support for parents and users of the system. This will be in the form of a new telephone service, enhanced website content and a number of face-to-face drop-in clinics held in EA offices and other locations during January 2019.
