Drumming Workshop

We are delighted to currently have the EA Music service delivering a 4 week drumming workshop with our P4-7 pupils. Weather Policy

The shop was established in 1946 and since then has had a prominent position on Warrenpoint's main street, supplying clothes and uniforms to the local community. Definitely the end of an era and we wish the family well in their well-deserved retirement.

Saints and Scholars in Newry will now be the sole supplier of Dromore Road's uniform and O'Hare's plan to pass on all their surplus stock to them before closing. I have advised Saints and Scholars that the tracksuit and polo shirt that is currently on sale in O'Hare's has the old logo and they have assured me only the new logoed uniform will be stocked for September.

As the year proceeds, standards in uniform often begin to slip. We appreciate that many are currently playing sport in the afternoon and subsequently wear their tracksuit to school on these days. On full uniform days, we would ask that you ensure your child is wearing a school tie and black shoes. For consistency, we also ask that girls who wish to wear tights should wear grey.
